

In Fall/Winter 2025, students were asked to self-reflect on three key aspects of attending Right At School's after school programs.



Leveraging the **Developmental Assets Profile** by the Search Institute, Right At School measured student gains in several key areas of social development over the course of a school year.





JUNIOR EDUCATOR PROGRAM

Through the Junior Educator program, 3rd-6th grade students are provided an opportunity to become peer leaders. Mentored by highly trained and experienced staff, they learn to plan, organize, and lead program activities, service-learning projects, and team-building activities.

In doing so, Junior Educators learn valuable leadership skills, improve their self-confidence, and act as role models and mentors for our younger students.



COMMUNITY IMPACT: RIGHT CLUB GIVES BACK

"Right Club Gives Back" is a key component of Right At School's programs — one in which students plan and launch service projects based on their own interests, including collecting socks for homeless shelter residents, making cards for a community nursing home, and sending messages of appreciation to firefighters in Los Angeles.



Right At School's involvement in charitable activities has significantly impacted communities nationwide, teaching students valuable lessons in empathy, organization, and the importance of giving back.

Right Club Gives Back is an initiative that expands on Right At School's core mission by actively involving students in community service and philanthropy. This is designed to complement existing curriculum by fostering a sense of social responsibility and civic engagement among students. Recently, Right Club's involvement in the San Diego Food Drive made a notable impact, collecting hundreds of pounds of food to help local families. This effort not only showcased community collaboration but also taught students valuable lessons. A PARENT'S STORY: FINDING COMMUNITY WITH RIGHT AT SCHOOL

When it became clear that Trey needed a community closer to home, we moved him back to Menifee, CA hoping to foster friendships and a sense of belonging.

When Trey transitioned back to in-person classes, we found ourselves in need of a reliable after school program that could accommodate our schedules and provide Trey with a nurturing environment. That's when we found Right At School.

As educators ourselves, my wife and I have early morning starts and late afternoon commitments, making it crucial to have a dependable resource to look after Trey. 

The communication from Right At School's staff is another aspect we've come to greatly value. They keep us updated on Trey's daily activities and are quick to share any concerns, which fosters a transparent and trusting relationship. A recent incident where Trey faced a small disciplinary issue was handled with such care that it turned into a positive learning experience for him, reinforcing the values we teach at home about learning from mistakes.

For any parent considering after school options, Right At School is exemplary not just for its convenience but for how it contributes to your child's overall growth. The peace of mind that comes from knowing your child is safe, learning, and having fun is immeasurable.



A PARENT'S STORY: PEACE OF MIND AND A SENSE OF BELONGING

My son, Caleb, and I came to Yuma, Arizona when he was 11 months old. We moved back home to Las Vegas to be with family during the COVID-19 pandemic, then returned to Yuma when he was in the middle of second grade.

When I looked online for childcare, I saw that Right At School offered a before and after school program at Caleb's new school. I was excited about that. I'm a single parent, I don't have family here who can help, so finding a program that was on-site at school was perfect for us.

In the beginning, Caleb struggled a little. The move was hard on him, and it was challenging being at a new school. I usually drop him off between 6:30 and 7:30 in the morning and then pick him up right before 6:00 pm. He was used to doing what he wanted at home and didn't want to join in the after school activities. Now he loves it!

One thing that helped a lot was that Caleb made friends at Right At School. At home, it's just him and me, so this gives him time to play with other kids and socialize. He likes all the fun things they do, and he likes the staff and enjoys being there.

I like the fact that I don't have to worry. I'm extremely busy every day, and there's a lot on my plate. Not having to worry about Caleb's safety and if he's okay makes everything so much better. I can focus at work and go about my day. That peace of mind is huge for me. The Right At School staff are great. When I walk in to say hi, everyone is in such good spirits. They communicate with me all the time about everything, which is awesome. I know that if something were to happen, I would get a call or text right away. But I don't worry about that because I know Caleb is in good hands, and he's having fun. Other families I've talked to say the same thing. I've heard nothing but good things from everyone.

Yuma now feels like home in the sense that Caleb loves going to school here. He feels a sense of belonging, and it's because of Right At School. It's like a family atmosphere. He feels very secure there — and if he wasn't, he's the kind of kid who would let me know right away.

I would encourage parents, especially single parents, to utilize Right At School because this is the perfect program for you and your kids. It can be hard trying to figure out what to do with your child when you're at work. When Caleb was going to daycare, I'd have to go pick him up after school and drop him off somewhere else, and that took a lot of time away from work. With Right At School, your child stays at school, so you don't have to worry about that. You can stay at work and do your job.

Not having to worry about anything? I don't know how you can put a price on that. For us, it's been wonderful.

DISTRICT IMPACT: SOUTH RIVER SCHOOL DISTRICT SOUTH RIVER, NJ

When Dr. Sylvia Zircher became superintendent in 2017, she sought a new kind of after school program that would enhance the school day with consistent activities, homework support, and healthy socialization. The program's homework support is a key benefit for working parents, ensuring children complete assignments before going home.

Initially, parents were hesitant about the transition from the previous childcare provider. However, Right At School's involvement in school events and parent outreach helped build trust. The program, serving pre-K to 8th grade, integrates Disguised Learning[™], aligning with state standards in literacy, math, science, social studies, arts, fitness, and service learning. Additionally, Durable Skills components are emphasized through collaborative activities.

Right At School also partners with the district for a summer program, blending camp-style fun with academic support.

Since implementation, enrollment has increased by 24%, with over 25% of families using subsidies for affordability. Parents appreciate the safe, structured environment, and survey feedback is consistently positive. The program has become an integral support system, contributing to students' well-being and academic success.

SCHOOL IMPACT: WYNCOTE ELEMENTARY **CHELTENHAM SCHOOL DISTRICT, PA**

In 2021, Wyncote Elementary School in Cheltenham School District (CSD) transitioned from its district-run after school program, C.L.A.S.P., to Right At School for before and after school care. Initially, parents worried about losing the program's close-knit environment, but Right At School eased concerns by hiring former C.L.A.S.P. staff and building strong relationships.

Four years later, and according to Principal Jim Taylor, parents now consider Right At School their child's favorite part of the day, highlighting its success in fostering a supportive and enriching experience for all students.
